HOME IMPROVEMENT LOANS

City of Milwaukee- TIN Program \$20,000- \$30,000 Low-Interest Loan

Milwaukee residents and investors are eligible for low interest rates and, depending on your income, a portion of the loan may be forgivable. This can be a great resource if you need financial assistance for making major, basic repairs on your home, such as roofing, siding, porch replacement, etc. Must Live between 35th st to 41st st and between Scott St and Lapham St.
